VOLUNTEER POSITION: SHELTER SUPPORTER

- Assist with incoming donations
- Help staff with general office support (copies, etc.)
- Submission of Volunteer Timesheet after each shift
- Ensure confidentiality at all times
- Contact staff as far in advance as possible if unable to make a shift
- Other duties as negotiated
