


### **CO-PARENT OF THE YEAR**


### **UNSUNG HERO**

For fathers showing consistent dedication and hard work while overcoming past struggles






### **FATHER OF THE YEAR**



**The Gerst Family Young Fathers Program** at Metropolitan Family Services is a community-based program that focuses on:

- Increasing young fathers' access to the labor force.
- Improving young fathers' financial literacy.
- Creating new and strengthening existing support systems for young fathers.
- Strengthening the relationship between young fathers and their children.

The core component of the program consists of a two-week job development and fathering series. This is followed by:

- Case Management Program participants meet with a case manager on a weekly basis to work on meeting goals in several areas including education, employment, health, social skills, child care, and financial management.
- Monthly Fathers Network Meeting The Fathers Network meeting is a time for fathers to share their experiences in finding and gaining employment with other fathers. It is also a forum for fathers to discuss obstacles they have had in searching for employment and finding answers or strategies for overcoming those obstacles.
- Father-Child Activities The bi-monthly father and child activity is often an educational trip for the children, thegoal of which is to enable the father to spend quality time with his child.
