EDUCATION

Early Childhood Collaboration brings together school districts, community agencies, early childhood providers and supporters to improve school readiness for children in under-resourced areas of Wheaton, Warrenville and Addison. Funded under The DuPage Foundation Bright and Early Initiative.

Early Childhood Education Services serve pregnant women, children 0-5 years of age, and their families to ensure school readiness for our youngest residents and empower families to improve their children's future. Home based, half day and full day services are available.

ECONOMIC STABILITY

Family Self-Sufficiency gives low-income families access to job training, education, mental health services, intensive career and family counseling, transportation and child care. Offered in partnership with the DuPage County Department of Community Services, the DuPage County Housing Authority and Worknet.

Supportive Housing Initiative for Families in Transition (SHIFT) works with community partners to provide permanent housing and long-term stability through mental health services, housing, case management and employment counseling.

EMOTIONAL WELLNESS

Adoption Support and Preservation provides home-based intervention to families formed through adoption or subsidized guardianship. Counseling, crisis intervention and 24-hour on-call assistance help address adjustment, grief/loss resolution, attachment, educational and emotional issues.

This DCFS-supported program also provides therapeutic respite services, psycho-educational and support groups, workshops and help securing resources.

Behavioral Health builds on individual strengths and capacity for change while addressing special needs, behavioral and situational problems, or mental health. Our clinical intervention and prevention services help individuals and families improve, learn and practice new coping skills and manage problems and stress at home, school and in the workplace. Counseling and psychiatric services are offered for children, families and adults. Services are provided in the office, client homes, schools, nursing homes, assisted living facilities, hospitals, and other human service agencies.

Grandparents Raising Grandchildren mobilizes support services for older caregivers who are raising children, including clinical observation, assessment, referrals, support and educational groups, and for both grandparents and grandchildren, if needed, family and individual counseling.

Integrated Healthcare Services are provided by a team of medical and behavioral health care specialists to meet patients' psychological, emotional and physical needs. This integrated health care model makes it easier for patients to access care, increases patients' capacity to follow doctor recommendations, addresses mental health issues and the key social determinants of health, and improves healthcare results while reducing healthcare costs.

Intensive Placement Stabilization provides clinically intensive therapeutic interventions to DCFS youth in foster care who are at risk of being removed from their foster home.

Senior Counseling helps physically, emotionally and/or economically vulnerable older adults function as independently as possible. It includes in-home or office assessments, family and individual counseling, support groups, case management and links to resources.

WEGO Together for Kids is a collaboration mobilizing West Chicago schools and community to address the health, safety and well-being of students and families. Our newest partner, United Way of Metropolitan Chicago, invests through its United Way Neighborhood Network.

EMPOWERMENT

Family Shelter Service of Metropolitan Family Services DuPage transforms lives by offering help and hope to those affected by domestic violence. Programming includes emergency shelter, court services and orders of protection, supportive services for children and adults, community-based services and prevention services.

Legal Aid Society provides legal assistance and community education to low-income individuals in the areas of domestic violence, immigration, human trafficking, employment and other legal topics.
