

We provide a wide range of behavioral health services designed to help empower children, adults, older adults, and families experiencing emotional, cognitive and behavioral challenges, domestic violence, mental illness or family problems.

What is behavioral health and how is it different from mental health?

Behavioral health refers to the relationship between our daily habits (good and bad) and their effect on our physical and mental health.

• Examples include eating habits, exercise routines and alcohol consumption.

Mental health is a component of behavioral health, and focuses solely on a person's psychological state.

All mental health issues are part of behavioral health, but not all behavioral health issues are related to mental health.

FAMILY SHELTER SERVICE DOMESTIC VIOLENCE TRAINING

Domestic violence is a very complex issue that affects one out of three women in her lifetime. The Illinois Coalition Against Domestic Violence (ICADV) therefore requires that all domestic violence staff, interns and volunteers who wish to provide direct services to survivors complete a minimum of 40 hours of training.

Family Shelter Service of Metropolitan Family Services DuPage (FSS of MFSD) has been approved by the Illinois Certified Domestic Violence Professional Board of Directors to offer this training. Our professional facilitators offer this training two to three times a year, and trainings are open to professionals and community members who wish to learn more about this devastating societal problem.

ABOUT THE TRAINING

FSS of MFSD offers the 40-hour domestic violence training several times per year. Details and training schedule will vary by training.

- Our next 40-hour training will take place in June 2022. Please fill out the wait list form to be notified of specific dates.
- As of July 2021, due to increasing costs of offering the training, our base cost of registration has increased. Discounts for staff, volunteers, and students are still available.


