

## <u>LEGAL AID SOCIETY – INDIVIDUAL RIGHTS & SOCIAL JUSTICE</u> <u>INTERN/EXTERN-SHIP</u>

The Individual Rights & Social Justice Practice group at Legal Aid Society has is seeking a law student intern/extern for Fall 2022. Fluency in Spanish is preferred, but not required. This is a part-time, unpaid position. This position is based out of our HQ in Chicago, IL, and will be a hybrid position, which is primarily remote, but occasional inperson work will be required at the office as needed. The exact start and end dates will be determined between the intern and their supervisor.

The Individual Rights & Social Justice Practice Group at LAS works to ensure victims of crime have access to a full array of legal and social services. The IR & SJ Practice Group primarily works with survivors of human trafficking, immigrant victims of crime, and individuals with certain employment-related legal concerns. This multi-disciplinary practice group engages in significant community outreach efforts and strives to ensure clients receive trauma informed services that address all of their needs, either through in-house services or by providing referrals to community partners.

## **RESPONSIBILITIES**

- 1. Assist in completing immigration forms and applications;
- 2. Participate with attorneys in client interviews;
- 3. Research case law and procedure for effective client representation;
- 4. Identify and analyze legal problems and solutions relevant to immigration, human trafficking, and crime victim rights representation;
- 5. Maintain client files; and
- 6. Work effectively with staff and a diverse client population.

## **QUALIFICATIONS**

The ideal candidate will possess the following attributes:

- 1. Spanish language proficiency (preferred)
- 2. Strong research and writing skills;
- 3. The ability to communicate effectively with attorneys, clients, and co-workers;
- 4. Strong organizational skills and attention to detail;
- 5. Ability to work effectively on individual assignments and as part of a team;
- 6. Patience and professionalism while working diverse clients; and
- 7. A willingness to ask questions and seek to clarify assignments and responsibilities.
