PURPOSE OF POSITION: Volunteers will assist survivors with the application process for an Order of Protection (OOP) including explaining the process, screening for services, providing technical assistance for completing the paperwork and providing emotional support and referrals.

LOCATION OF ACTIVITY: DuPage County Courthouse, 505 N. County Farm Rd Wheaton

VOLUNTEER BENEFITS:

- Opportunity to serve and support survivors of domestic violence who may be unaware of FSS
- Develop crisis intervention skills which are useful in a variety of settings

- Increased knowledge of community resources
- Active volunteers may obtain reference and or recommendation letters

VOLUNTEER COMMITMENT: Minimum commitment: Volunteers must be able to commit to the program for a twelve-month period and work a minimum of one full day per week (typically 8 hours). Due to the sensitive and complicated nature of the work and amount of training required, less time severely limits a satisfactory volunteer experience.

PRINCIPLE RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES:

- Log in and out of Volgistics volunteer system every shift
- Welcome individuals who enter the FSS office space
- Provide survivors accurate and appropriate information about the process for obtaining an OOP
- Assist survivors in completing relevant screening documents for service eligibility
- Provide directions to help individuals navigate through the courthouse
- Provide emotional support, modeling trauma informed care
- Assist survivors with completing OP petitions (depending on length of time volunteering)
- Provide linkages with other resources and referrals both inside and outside of FSS
- Prepare proper documentation for client files
- Represent FSS in a positive and professional manner at all times
- Ensure confidentiality at all times
- Contact staff as far in advance as possible if unable to make a shift
- Other duties as negotiated

- Participate in tabling or other community events as needed.
- Gather information for possible community contacts or partnerships.
