



FROM OUR CEO and Board Chair

Metropolitan Family Services (MFS) completed Fiscal Year 2025 from a position of strength. In fact, throughout the last decade our organization has continued to bolster its programs, services, infrastructure and balance sheet. We at MFS have experienced unprecedented growth in many aspects of our work, allowing us to impact 205,511 families and individuals throughout Cook and DuPage Counties and other regions of Illinois.

Highlights of the year include the Southeast Chicago Center, which expanded into three new suburban communities to provide services for seniors and those with disabilities that promote their independence and dignity. The Legal Aid Society successfully completed its two-year partnership with the City of Chicago where it provided legal services for arrivals to the city. LAS served in various roles over the past two years, spanning the management of fund distribution to organizations who represented clients seeking legal refuge, offered additional legal services, and provided case management.

In addition, the Southwest and DuPage Centers were credentialed to provide substance abuse services, a new and exciting first step for us. Also, the Metropolitan Peace Academy continued to grow its reach and depth, celebrating 124 graduates as well as its 20th Street Outreach Cohort and first Fellowship Cohort, the latter designed as a network to support leaders of Community Violence Intervention organizations. And so much more importantly, life-empowering work is happening across our 10 centers.

That said, there is evidence of challenging times ahead. Notably, the uncertainty of federal and other public funding, which weighs heavily on most human services. Roughly a quarter of Metropolitan's funding is federally sourced, most of which is passed through the State of Illinois and local government agencies. MFS has taken steps to be prepared to react to the changing funding conditions, but the looming uncertainty and the anxiety it engenders are heavy. We are grateful that our supporters are leaning in, asking how they can help, and partnering with us to creatively respond during this time.

Our mission is our anchor, and our strength lies in our people. We at Metropolitan Family Services are confident that we can move forward maintaining positive momentum to do the work that is so critical to those we serve. Your support enables communities to learn, earn, heal and thrive.

As our history has shown these last 168 years, we are resilient and capable of persevering through tough times. Thank you for your continued partnership, support and trust in our stewardship that allows us to do the essential work of transforming lives.

ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES:

A Lifeline for Safety and Suppor





"There are times in a family domestic violence situation a person may feel like they have no recourse, no place to turn, and they are just stuck. But it's important to know support is available. You don't have to stay in the situation."

When Theresia Jackson experienced abuse from a family member, she turned to a program she had learned about during her 22 years as a community school counselor. Theresia called the Illinois Department on Aging to be connected to Metropolitan Family Services' (MFS') Adult Protective Services (APS).

Through the program, Theresia met Luz, an Intervention Specialist with APS.

"The personal concern and willingness from Luz to be supportive and look out for what I needed and what I was going through — that support was really important to me," Theresia recalls.

Luz met with Theresia in her home to survey her situation, explain available services, and develop a plan that kept Theresia in control of her own decisions. Luz describes APS as "a self-determination program" that investigates abuse, neglect and exploitation while respecting clients' independence. "We work with them, not for them," Luz says. "We are the support to help them make the right decisions."

When Theresia expressed that she wanted legal assistance, Luz connected her with MFS' Legal Aid Society, which helped her secure an emergency order of protection. "I truly believe that she [Luz] has my interests [at heart]," Theresia says. "I felt supported with what I was going through, that it wasn't something I had to handle on my own."

Theresia explains how isolating abuse can be for victims. "It can be a shameful situation for a person to be in, when they are being abused. It's on a personal level, and they still may have concern for the loved one, even though the loved one is being abusive."

Since Theresia entered into APS in May of 2025, she has grown remarkably. "She was ashamed of her situation; she was hesitant to talk about it even with me," Luz recalls. "For about a month and a half, she didn't want to go out. Now, hearing her say she has plans [for her future] makes me very excited for her. She's no longer afraid. She knows that she has people around her that are going to care for her."

Theresia considers herself fortunate to have supportive adult children who stand by her and to have Luz in her corner. "I appreciate the





CREATING OPPORTUNITIES AND CONFIDENCE:

YouthBuild Program Equips for an Mpowered Future

"It's amazing for him to come back and say, 'Hey, I really don't know what I would be doing if you guys had not taken a chance on me." - Tiffiney Conaway, Job Developer, YouthBuild, speaking about program participant Aidan When Aidan found out his school's auto mechanics program was eliminated, he felt lost. His future plans were dashed. But when Metropolitan's YouthBuild program, which trains teens and young adults for construction careers, opened an exciting new door, Aidan walked in! He earned multiple trade certifications in record time – and gained huge confidence in himself.

"When Aidan first started, he was very shy, very quiet," says Tiffiney Conaway, a Job Developer for YouthBuild and Aidan's lead mentor. "And he was so brave. He told me, 'I struggle in some areas when it comes down to understanding certain things. And I'm going to need some help.' And I was like, 'No problem, Aidan. We got you.'"

Aidan shares, "I don't like talking at all. But they were telling us every day, introduce yourself, introduce yourself ... So I was like, might as well go with the flow, you know? I stepped up." He adds that YouthBuild "wants people to have their own voices in the crowd."

Aidan learned to participate and use construction tools. He gained trade and life skills. "We learned a lot about leadership, self-respect and respecting others," he says. Staff also prepped Aidan for interviews. He says, "I felt like that was like a really good game changer, you know? So I don't feel nervous."

Aidan completed all his OSHA (Occupational Safety and Health Administration) training, and he is excited about the possibilities ahead. His YouthBuild team couldn't be happier. "He's gone from being the shy individual to being a leader," Tiffiney comments. "You see his strength; you see his growth. You see the confidence he has, and that is everything to me."

With the support of Tiffiney and the YouthBuild team, Aidan is continuing his high school education and is planning on a career in urban planning and construction management. He's now envisioning a totally new future. Aidan is a living example of what happens when belief, hard work and support meet opportunity.

"Great things come out of the YouthBuild program.

Participants get trained in using forklifts, drone flying —
they get certifications that they can take with them just
about anywhere. They have opportunities to be successful

My name is Laura Azcatl. After meeting my husband, Ruben, our family soon began to grow: Ayla was born in January 2012, followed by Anya in 2013, and Aytana in 2014.

In 2016, my youngest daughter, Aleyda, was born. Although I felt joy, I worried that I wouldn't be able to work or continue my education, so I began looking for programs to support Aytana's development, which is when I found Metropolitan Family Services' (MFS') Addison Children's Center.

There, I met a Family Support Worker who helped me enroll Aytana in the Home-Based program. Her Parent Child Educator visited us weekly with engaging and creative activities—one of my favorites was when she brought spray bottles and veggie-based paint for Aytana to create art in our backyard.

Later, I met the Family Support Worker from Early Head Start, who helped me complete Aleyda's application for the program. Aleyda joined the Infant Room at ACC at just 8 months old and transitioned to Head Start the following year.

With all four of my daughters in school, I was invited to work at a daycare where the director encouraged me to begin my Early Childhood Education (ECE) training and pursue my Associate's Degree at St. Augustine College. I completed my degree in 2022 and continued my education at National Louis University, which is when I applied for an Assistant Teacher position at MFS. To my surprise, I was contacted by the ECE Director at MFS DuPage for a Lead Teacher position and started in 2023.

That year was challenging as I balanced a new job at MFS, university classes, home and family. After pausing my studies to complete Bilingual and Administration endorsements (similar to certifications), I finally graduated with my Bachelor's Degree in Early Childhood Education at 35, with my family proudly cheering me on.

MFS played a huge role in my professional growth. They believed in me, promoted me to Lead Teacher, and supported me as I became Director Qualified. Then a new opportunity appeared: Family Support Worker, the first role I engaged with when finding MFS. At first, I wasn't sure if I could take on something so different, but my ECE supervisor saw potential in me and encouraged me to apply. With her support, I was promoted in February 2025 to Family Support Worker at the Addison Children's Center.

"Now, just a few months into my new role, I know I still have so much to learn—but I'm ready. I'm even considering going back to school for a degree in Social Work. It won't be easy, but I've learned that when you truly want something and believe in yourself, anything is possible."

I USED TO WEAR A MASK:

How Jan Found Healing and Hope

For Jan, taking care of her mental health has been a lifelong journey - and one that she is still pursuing.

In her 30s, Jan Brooks found herself suffering from depression and suicidal thoughts but eventually found solace in therapy. "Back then, therapy helped me learn my triggers and gave me tools to support myself," she recalls. Those tools carried her for years, but as time passed, she began to feel the dark thoughts creeping back.

By the 2010s, Jan knew she needed more support. "I could feel myself slipping," she says. "Insurance pointed me to Metropolitan Family Services [MFS], and I'm so glad. I'm so happy they put me in contact [with MFS] because then I met Karen."

Karen Cannon, Jan's therapist at MFS through our Behavioral Health program, became a steady source of guidance and encouragement. Beyond traditional therapy sessions, Karen connected Jan to a variety of therapeutic MFS programs that would help her rebuild her confidence and form new relationships.


"Working with Metropolitan constantly makes me aware and helps with my self-esteem problem, letting me know that I'm worth it. If I have a problem, Karen is there. I'm able to bring it to her and that helps. I'm very thankful to Metropolitan and their services. Everyone is nice. I want to introduce other people to MFS."

"Sometimes I let go of some things that are going on with me or the way I think about things, and that's very helpful. I have something to look forward to, and I know I'm going to be able to express myself."

Jan also has attended other behavioral health events at MFS, including a workshop that opened her eyes to new ways of understanding herself. "[The workshop] was about PTSD [post-traumatic stress disorder], and I thought, well, I don't have PTSD," she recalls. "But after going, I realized I do have trauma that I wasn't aware of. Metropolitan is a learning experience for me, and I'm taking a lot of life lessons away from it."

Karen has witnessed Jan's growth firsthand. "Her overall ability to not assume the blame or responsibility has grown. Now she's putting the ownership on others who need to be held accountable instead of on herself," Karen observes, noting that Jan has been hard on herself in the past.

Today, Jan feels stronger, more authentic, and more hopeful. "I used to wear a mask. This is not a mask now; this is me," she says. Once suicidal in her 30s, Jan now embraces life. "Every day I can get, I'm happy for it. I want to live. Life is good, and I'm glad to be here. I want to experience life."





A SAFER CHICAGO:

MPI Advances Efforts in Community Violence Intervention

- The Metropolitan Peace Academy (MPA) graduated 52 Street Outreach Workers, 25 Victim Advocates, and 30 Case Managers. Additionally, 13 individuals graduated from the inaugural class of the MPA's Management and Supervision Fellowship. To date, more than 600 graduates have passed through the MPA since its inception in January 2018.
- Over the Memorial Day and Fourth of July weekends, Chicago saw historic declines in gun violence, with city officials attributing some of the success to Communities Partnering 4 Peace (CP4P), a coalition of Community Violence Intervention (CVI) organizations convened by MPI. In a Community Safety Midyear Update, the Chicago Police Department reported a 32.7% decrease in homicides, with 40% fewer shooting victims halfway through 2025.
- MPI, Chicago CRED, and four CP4P organizations helped expand the "Scaling Community Violence Intervention for a Safer Chicago" (SC2) initiative, a coordinated plan among CVI groups, philanthropic, business, and government leaders aimed at reducing gun violence across the city. Approximately 75% of the individuals most at risk of shooting or being shot in North Lawndale, Austin, Humboldt Park, and Little Village will be served. Garfield Park, New City, and Englewood are in the pipeline.
- Chicago's Peacekeepers Program was found to be effective in reducing gun violence, according to a report from Northwestern University's Center for Neighborhood Engaged Research and Science (CORNERS). The analysis found that hotspots experienced a 41% overall reduction in victimizations in 2023-2024 compared to the previous two-year period. Additionally, Peacekeeper community areas saw a 31% decrease in shooting victimizations in 2023-2024 compared to the previous two-year period. Originally launched in 2018, the program aims to address the economic barriers to opportunity and to reduce group-related conflicts among those at highest risk for gun violence involvement.

- MPI launched its Youth Interventions initiative, beginning with the first program: Back to Our Future 2.0. In collaboration with Chicago Public Schools and the Mayor's Office of Community Safety, MPI supports youth of highest promise, ages 14 to 21, who have a history of chronic absenteeism, are juvenile justice system-involved, and/or have experienced the effects of violence in their communities.
- Chicago-area CVI groups organized a CVI Rally and Legislative Action Day in Springfield, IL to call for sustained funding in the Reimagine Public Safety Act (RPSA), a bill aimed at reducing gun violence and promoting safety across communities. State Senators Robert Peters, Celina Villanueva, and Elgie Sims were among the elected officials who supported the day of action.
- MPI was featured in the National Football League's "Inspire Change" campaign, which aims to reduce barriers to opportunity and create positive change in communities of color. The commercial aired nationwide in over 100 markets, according to Nielsen. Additionally, the NFL and Players Coalition announced the renewal of a grant to MPI that will further efforts to reduce gun violence in Chicago. MPI and nine other nonprofit organizations received grants totaling nearly \$2.5 million.
- MPI and City Club of Chicago hosted a panel titled "Reducing Gun Violence: How the Community and Police Are Working Together." Moderated by MPI Director of Field Instruction Steve Perkins, the discussion centered on the areas where CVI workers and law enforcement intersect.
- A delegation of leaders from CP4P traveled to Ghana with support from Crown Family Philanthropies. The group aimed to learn from the country's rich history and culture while reflecting on their roles in CVI back home in Chicago. Together, they visited historical landmarks, honored their ancestors, and celebrated traditional rituals. Metropolitan Family Services (MFS) President and CEO Ric Estrada called the trip "enlightening, painful, and humbling."



- CP4P hosted "March to the Polls" events across
 Chicago's South, West, and North sides in an effort to increase civic engagement in neighborhoods most affected by gun violence. Key neighborhoods included Austin, Garfield Park, Humboldt Park, Englewood, Little Village, and Back of the Yards. CP4P is a coalition of 15 local organizations serving 28 Chicago neighborhoods dealing with high levels of gun violence.
- The Chicago Sports Alliance (CSA) consisting of the Chicago Bears, Blackhawks, Bulls, Cubs, and White Sox provided grant funding to MPI for its continued work in keeping city residents safe. CSA's grant funding specifically supports MPI's workforce development and behavioral health services.
- MPI's Workforce Development team hosted a career fair
 in collaboration with Skills for Chicagoland's Future, the
 Public Safety Task Force from the Civic Committee of the
 Commercial Club of Chicago, and the Cara Collective.
 The event welcomed employers such as JLL, Hyatt, JewelOsco, and Navy Pier, and some job seekers were hired on
 the spot for seasonal, part-time, and full-time jobs.
- CP4P organizations hosted advocacy meetings
 in their respective neighborhoods to discuss the
 CVI work being done to help reduce gun violence.
 These events welcomed community leaders, residents,
 law enforcement, and elected officials as they explored
 prevention tactics and the progress they've experienced
 in their areas.
- Several MPI staff members received advanced degrees and licensure, as a testament to MFS and MPI's continued interest in learning and professional development. The graduates included Celia Castulo (Master's in Social Work at the University of Illinois Chicago), Carla Galvan (Bachelor's in Political Science at DePaul), Marshawnna Howell (Master's in Social Work at Chicago State University), Caroline Nakahara (Master's in Social Work at the University of Illinois Chicago), and Dominic Yao (Master's in Social Work at the University of Illinois Chicago). Additionally, Vaughn Bryant completed the Strategic Perspectives in Nonprofit Management Certificate Program at Harvard Business School and Domonique McCord completed the Leadership Greater Chicago's 2025 Signature Fellowship Program.
- MFS CEO Ric Estrada and MPI Executive Director Vaughn Bryant were honored as "Notable Leaders in Philanthropy" by Crain's Chicago Business. Estrada's efforts to advance MFS's 168-year legacy of social service providing a wide spectrum of wrap-around services spanning education, economic stability, emotional wellness and empowerment/legal aid have had a major impact on the city. Bryant's work to help lead the implementation and expansion of CVI in Chicago through street outreach, behavioral health, workforce development, legal aid, and training through the MPA has aided in the decrease of gun violence in the city's most at-risk neighborhoods.
- During Gun Violence Awareness Month in June, MPI and a coalition of CVI groups under the umbrella of the Illinois Peace Project launched the inaugural Peace Week Chicago. The week-long event builds collective momentum toward a safer city by hosting community events, conferences, social media campaigns, days of action, and more.



MFS helped **99%** of adoptive families stay together

of domestic violence survivors experienced fewer trauma symptoms like fear, anxiety and nightmares after 4 or fewer counseling sessions at MFS, opening the door to stability.

- 525 VOlunteers provided 25,930+ hours of service to support MFS programs, an \$889,140 value.
- Our domestic violence housing program aided 93% of survivors in finding a new home, and 95% found long-term stability through permanent housing. Survivors were housed in under six weeks, which is half the time required by the State of Illinois.
- MFS answered 6,576 calls on the 24-hour domestic violence hotline, providing survivors and their loved ones with immediate guidance, safety planning, and connections to vital resources.

13,312 individuals and families attended 261 Light in the Night community gathering events held by CP4P, with no violent incidents.





LAS secured 5,231 hours of volunteer and pro bono legal assistance, an in-kind donation value of \$2.17M, helping us exponentially magnify our impact.





Our legal advocacy resulted in **over \$2.34M** in total financial awards, including child support, judgments, settlements and other awards.

- LAS secured 421
 Orders of Protection to safeguard
 632 adults and children.
- LAS helped 249 families navigate the court system to avoid eviction and remain stably housed.
